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The SENYFoundation is a private non profit making foundation created in 1996 with the main aim of promoting research into schizophrenia and chronic mental illnesses. SENYFoundation is registered with The Autonomous Government of Catalonia Foundation Register and classified as a welfare and scientific benefit foundation by resolution 10-07-1996. Registration number 998.

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As a healthy tradition, each year we take account of the activities carried out by the **SENYFoundation** over the previous year. This 2004 Annual Report again serves a double purpose. On the one hand it is to provide information about the activities carried out during this period, and on the other to show our gratitude as a foundation to those people and institutions, both public and private who have in one way or another contributed to making it all possible.

For the **SENYFoundation**, this has been a year of consolidation and advancement in the projects started at the end of 2003, and also of the projection and promotion of our activities and products.

Within the area of research, networking, that is to say in institutional collaboration with professionals and research centres, has reaped amazing rewards. Also, the "la Caixa" Foundation has provided important economic assistance to the **SENYFoundation** within the framework of their 2004 call for projects aimed at groups of people affected by psychical disabilities or mental illness. This assistance has been definitive in driving forward the project "Family Health and Schizophrenia: Multi-centred intervention and evaluation regarding the effectiveness of Family Work in schizophrenia".

The collaboration has also allowed a project which we are particularly enthusiastic about to be started: "Validation of Measurement Instruments." We are convinced that having access to validated instruments in our context will be beneficial for the clinics as well as the researchers.

The second edition of the bibliometric study has already started and will constitute a large part of the **SENYFoundation**'s activities during 2005. It is a greatly improved edition which deals with the analysis of collaborations between Spanish authors of scientific articles regarding schizophrenia. This second version can be a reference guide for professionals and financial research agencies to provide more in depth knowledge regarding "who's who" in Spanish scientific achievements relating to schizophrenia. We are able to count on the invaluable collaboration of professionals from the Catalan Agency for Health Technology Assessment and Research (CAHTA) and the University of Barcelona, as well as a scientific committee made up of top professionals.

Many of the projects financed by the **SENYFoundation** – CAHTA call for research projects have been completed throughout 2004. This is great news, since an investment of around 200 thousand Euros is starting to show tangible results which will become widespread in 2005. It is the aim of the **SENYFoundation** to publish a scientific report on the main fundings, as well as a specific Working Paper, in which the main researchers of each project can communicate to the general public, simply and informatively, how the results of their projects improve knowledge about schizophrenia, its diagnosis and treatment.

Finally, with regard to research, we have given our support to the proposal for a new TV3 Tele-Marathon regarding neurodevelopment disorders in infancy and adolescence. We hope that this will be considered by the TV3 Marathon Foundation. This could certainly provide a new impetus for research in Spain.

It is clear that research should be able to continue in order to reap the relevant rewards. This is the reason why the SENYFoundation, based on calls for projects and previous awards, is determined to propel a new public research tender regarding schizophrenia and severe mental disorders. The aim of this call for projects is to award just one quality research project, preferably multi-centred and in collaboration with prestigious and international foreign institutions. In 2004 work was carried out successfully in two key areas in this respect: 1) fundraising, and 2) base models for the call for projects. The plan is to make the call for projects public during the first half of 2005 and we believe that it will represent a great opportunity for all the mental health centres and professionals.

In the area of training for professionals, we would highlight that we have carried out the 4th edition of the course on research methods, this time more specialised in mental health, dealing with information search strategies on line, scientific data bases and meta-analysis. This course aims to improve the abilities and skills of those professionals interested in research and evaluation, providing them with the reference methods and practices in this field. Also, the appropriate supervision course regarding the Family Work techniques given by Professor Leff, has been carried out for those who attended the introduction course for the aforementioned technique at the Institute of Psychiatry in London. As is customary in the SENYFoundation we have continued to provide grants and offer sponsored travel to professionals so that they may attend selected courses and various international conferences.

Close collaboration with the Cuatrecasas Foundation has allowed us to organise the already traditional symposia in English about themes related to psychiatry and psychology. These symposia provide an opportunity to share knowledge and the results of the research carried by the different national and foreign centres, as well as allowing the attendees to improve their communication skills in English. The symposia culminated in an intensive course of scientific presentations given in English.

With regard to the dissemination of the scientific information and knowledge, we would highlight the new **SENYFoundation** web site www.senyfundacio.org. It contains a web page with an emphasis on services, the diffusion of the **SENYFoundation** activities and the material published by us, as well as news and the very latest from the scientific world, guaranteeing rigour and quality. This Annual report dedicates a large section to the description of its contents and most important services.

The **SENYFoundation** aims to be an observatory for schizophrenia, which is why it has been present at various national and international conferences and symposia. This presence has allowed us to be up to date on all of the very latest information regarding this illness, its etiology and advances in its treatment. Some of the most noteworthy conferences were the 12th Biennale Winter Workshop on Schizophrenia (Davos, April 2004), the ISSFAL Congress (Brighton, June-July 2004), the VIII National Congress on Psychiatry and Biological Psychiatry (Bilbao, October 2004) together with other national and international symposia, workshops and conferences, which were well worth attending as they were both interesting and relevant. They also provided us with an opportunity to disseminate the **SENYFoundation**'s activities.

Finally, I do not wish to finish without referring to an event of which I am personally very proud. Last 9th July 2004 we were able to organise a workshop regarding lifestyles and schizophrenia. The event included top grade speakers and the attendance of patients and family members. With events such as these we want to draw ever closer attention to the reality of the families and bring scientific research and knowledge to society on a whole. The report that you are reading bears testimony to this and the rest of the initiatives and activities carried out in 2004.

All of this activity has been made possible thanks to the collaboration and the work of many people and professionals throughout Spain. We would hereby wish to recognise their effort and encourage them to continue with this work in the future. Thank you to everyone.

Schizophrenia is a serious mental illness which affects 1% of the population. In Spain alone, it is estimated that there are some 400,000 people affected by this illness. The illness usually involves a loss of contact with reality and a functional deterioration regarding many aspects of life. It also affects the families of these patients, as it means an increase in their responsibilities, as well as the healthcare systems and society on a whole owing to the elevated economic and social cost involved. The stigma associated with mental illnesses has also meant that for many years, sufferers have been avoided or hidden away. Today, thanks to the participation of the scientific community as well as society itself, this is changing. Currently, we know that it is an illness which is biologically based, even though we do not know its causes in any great depth.

There is no cure for schizophrenia. Drugs and treatments which are more or less effective do exist, which above all control the symptoms, even though they do also frequently cause undesirable side effects. Research into this illness becomes fundamental when looking to the future. Neither a cure, nor hope for improvements will be achieved without the contribution of rigorous and quality research.



OBJECTIVES AND MISSION

The SENYFoundation is a private non profit making foundation, founded in 1996 with the objective of promoting research in the field of schizophrenia and severe mental disorders.

Our mission is to be a point of reference for all those professionals interested in mental health, as well as a centre for the promotion and provision of basic, clinical and social research, training and the management of knowledge.

PROMOTION OF BASIC, CLINICAL AND SOCIAL RESEARCH

SENYFoundation – CAHTA CALL FOR RESEARCH PROJECTS

The **SENYFoundation** together with the CAHTA (Catalan Agency for Health Technology Assessment and Research) held a public grants tender for research projects into schizophrenia (DOGC, 25th October 1999).

Of the 42 projects presented, 8 were prioritised, with a total funding of 192,000 Euros. The institutions and centres that won the project tender have continued to carry out their projects and are completing the final reports for them. In 2005 the most important findings will be formally presented in public.

"BRAIN PHOSPHOLIPIDS: FATTY ACIDS AND SCHIZOPHRENIA" PROJECT

The benefits derived from the use of polyunsaturated fatty acids in the treatment of patients with schizophrenia have been studied in depth at the SENYFoundation. The scientific evidence found does not clearly establish that the use of these nutritional supplements implies an improvement in patients. In this regard, wider sample studies are needed in order to reach rigorous conclusions. 
BIBLIOMETRIC STUDY REGARDING RESEARCH INTO SCHIZOPHRENIA IN SPAIN

Promoting research into schizophrenia comes hand in hand with recognising the efforts of our scientific community in this field. As a result, the **SENYFoundation** has published, in a Working Paper format, a first bibliometric study regarding schizophrenia in Spain. This study is available in printed and electronic (PDF) format on our web page www.senyfundacio.org.


This study has a twofold objective. On the one hand, it aims to show, as objectively as possible and using bibliometric methods, what is colloquially known as a " who's who" in research into schizophrenia in our closest context. On the other hand, it aims to identify possible networks, collaboration and potential within active groups. We believe that this information could be of great interest and value for the researchers themselves as well as the national and international financial research agencies. This first study was presented at the *IV Conference Sociology for the Future*, Barcelona 10th – 11th June.

The **SENYFoundation** has already started to design the second bibliometric study, more comprehensive than the first edition already mentioned, widening the bibliographic research strategies, including new analysis variables, and making use of a programme specifically for the graphic illustration of the relationship networks derived from it. We believe that the visibility of the efforts of the researchers and groups is not only necessary, but also imperative to bring research ever closer to our society.

FAMILY HEALTH AND SCHIZOPHRENIA (FAMILY WORK)

The SENYFoundation has driven forward an applied research project called "Family Work and Schizophrenia: Multi-centred Intervention and evaluation regarding the effectiveness of the family work technique in schizophrenia." The objective of the project is to determine the effectiveness of family intervention for patients affected by schizophrenia in Catalonia, using a multi-centred format carried out by therapists specifically trained in the family work techniques. 20-30 nuclear families will be selected (including informal carers) with, as a minimum, one member diagnosed with schizophrenia who complies with the high need assistance criteria. In total, it is estimated that 75 people will directly benefit from the project, particularly the indirect beneficiaries given the repercussions of the therapy on the rest of the family members, people that live with the sufferer and on the different professionals of the Mental Health Services.

The centres participating in the study include the **SENYFoundation** (Project Coordinator); Parc Taulí Corporation, Psychiatric Service (Sabadell); Clinical Hospital (Barcelona); Welfare Centre Dr. Emili Mira (Santa Coloma de Gramenet); the Institute for Sanitary Assistance (IAS) Hospitalary Parc Martí and Julià; CP Brian Penitentiary Psychiatric Hospital Unit (Capellades); and the Acute Unit of the Sant Joan de Déu Hospital (Sant Boi). The results of the study are expected to be available during the first quarter of 2006. This study benefited from the partial financing of the "La Caixa" Foundation.

VALIDATION OF MEASUREMENT INSTRUMENTS AND MENTAL HEALTH

If, for example, a thermometer allows us to measure body temperature, in the same way specific measurement instruments are needed in psychiatric and psychological interventions (symptomatology, evolution of the illness, prognosis, effect, drug compliance, level of functional or social adaptation, quality of life, family responsibility, etc). Many of these instruments are produced and developed internationally. We know that in order to use these same instruments in a socio-cultural context different to those where they were produced, it is necessary to adapt them and test them again to ensure that they are appropriate for their intended purpose (validation process). Having access to these instruments becomes fundamental for the correct recognition of important aspects of our interventions, but also to conduct quality research. "Validation of Measurement Instruments" is a project in collaboration with research and mental health assistance centres in Catalonia which will make scales available, which until now have not been validated. The project was started in 2004 and the scales and instruments to be validated were prioritised. The first results will be seen at the end of 2005.

TRAINING

METHODOLOGICAL COURSE FOR RESEARCH INTO MENTAL HEALTH (4TH EDITION)

Investigation into mental health is a fairly wide and specialized field which requires solid theoretical and practical training, aimed at improving knowledge of the illness, its treatment and the evaluation of clinical practice.

The **SENYFoundation** organized the 4th edition of the methodological course in November and December under the title: *Information searches and meta-analysis in mental health*. The objective of this course was to provide the theoretical and practical bases needed to identify and efficiently use the main efficient sources of information, be aware of the methodology needed to conduct complex bibliographic searches and the methods of quantitative synthesis of scientific fact, its use and applicability.

The course was much more orientated towards the specific needs of the professionals and researchers. The 21 attendees, three of whom had been awarded grants by the **SENYFoundation**, used the IT equipment in the classrooms to carry out the bibliographic searches on-line and familiarise themselves with the meta-analysis software.

The course took place in the Institute for Higher Education at the Pompeu Fabra University (IDEC), and lasted for a total of 36 hours divided between theory and practical classes. The course was accredited by the Catalan Council of Continual Medical Education with a total of 6.4 credits.

FAMILY WORK SUPERVISION COURSE

On the 24th, 25th, and 26th March, the **SENYFoundation** organised the Family Work technique supervision course in Barcelona. This supervision was aimed at all those professionals, previously awarded grants by the **SENYFoundation** to attend training courses in this technique given in London. The programme coordinator was Professor Julian Leff of the London Institute of Psychiatry.

SYMPOSIA IN ENGLISH

In 2004, the **SENYFoundation** organized a total of 20 symposia in English in the Cuatrecasas Foundation about themes related to schizophrenia and mental illness. The objective continued to be the practice of verbal and written communication in English, in order to stimulate and facilitate the participation of Spanish researchers in international conferences and meetings.

Each presentation was followed by a discussion during which English teacher S. Kelly commented on and corrected areas of grammar, pronunciation and vocabulary. The participation of speakers was on an entirely voluntary basis and attendance was open to all and free. During 2004, the **SENYFoundation** worked to be able to offer a more dynamic web site, aimed at the professional's needs and with additional services. This new communication tool is finally up and running (www.senyfundacio.org) and is available to all professionals and those interested in the research into severe mental disorders. We would also like this new framework of interrelation to offer a new environment for network collaboration.

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The main services offered by the web are:

• Current information about the SENYFoundation and its research, training and educational activities.



- News about schizophrenia. On the home page there is a list of the latest treatments, research, grants, conferences, etc. The news is updated twice a week by the SENYFoundation itself.
- Virtual library. The document base can be accessed through our web site and reservations of the required bibliographic resources can be made. The SENYFoundation offers this service free to the whole of Spain with the aim of facilitating access to useful information for research and training purposes.



- Documental resources. It includes links which may be useful when searching for information about psychiatry, and links with medical evidence based Data Bases, pharmacology, etc.
- Material published by the SENYFoundation. Over recent years, the SENYFoundation has participated in the creation and publishing of a variety of books and documents. In this

CLINICAL PRACTICE GUIDELINE ON SCHIZOPHRENIA

During 2004 the **SENYFoundation** has continued to distribute the *Clinical Practice Guideline in the Treatment of Schizophrenia Patients*, developed by the Catalan Agency for Health Technology Assessment and Research (CAHTA) and the Mental Health Forum.

The objective of this guideline is to provide recommendations for the care of patients with schizophrenia regarding diagnostic procedures, therapy and rehabilitation, with the aim of assisting the professional decision making process and to improve the suitability of treatment for the patient, offering them various therapeutic and rehabilitative options according to the characteristics of their illness.



The main users of this Guideline are the psychiatrists, psychologists, nurses, and social workers as well as other mental health and primary healthcare professionals.

The guideline is available in three formats, an extensive guide, a short guide and leaflet summarizing the recommendations listed in the Guideline. This documentation can be accessed through the CAHTA web page www.aatrm.net

DISSEMINATION OF COURSES AND GRANTS

During 2005, the SENYFoundation will continue to carry out the same activities and services, reinforcing them with new projects. With regard to the promotion of **research**, we would highlight that it is anticipated that the final results of the projects awarded prizes in the CAHTA- SENYFoundation call for research projects will be presented. We will also continue with the Family Work project already started in 2004, which aims to understand the effectiveness of psychosocial therapy directed at families.

Key roles will also be played in 2005 by the second edition of the bibliometric study, a more comprehensive and improved version and the multi-centred group for the validation of measurement instruments will start to work at full capacity, which will allow us to enjoy validated and adapted versions of international scales.

And finally, we would highlight an important research financing initiative, through which the **SENYFoundation** will award a prize to a quality project regarding schizophrenia opened to international research centres.

With regard to training and dissemination, the SENYFoundation will continue to boost the advanced methodological courses for research into mental health, the Family Work and other courses from our training programme. The accreditation and evaluation of all of these training initiatives must also be a priority together with attending national and international conferences and workshops of great scientific relevance. And finally, the document centre and our web page will continue to grow and broaden their services, distributing educational and informative material to improve knowledge about schizophrenia among the general population.
